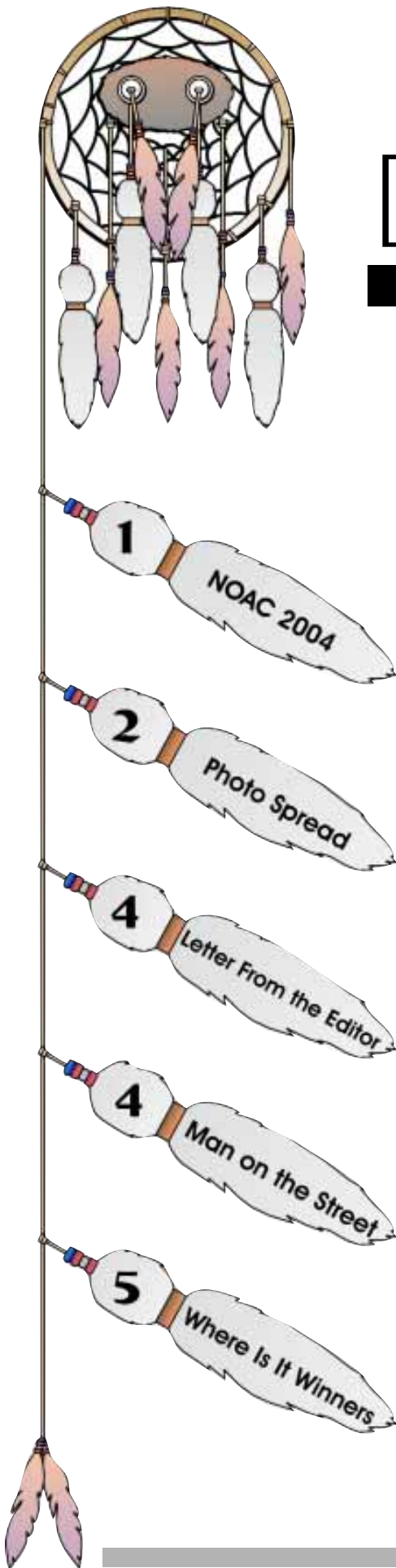
the message of the conference each night with original productions, awards ceremonies and Native American dance competitions.

The NOAC ends on what is called Founder's Day, a day-long event featuring booths from lodges across the country, games and a parade. The conference will

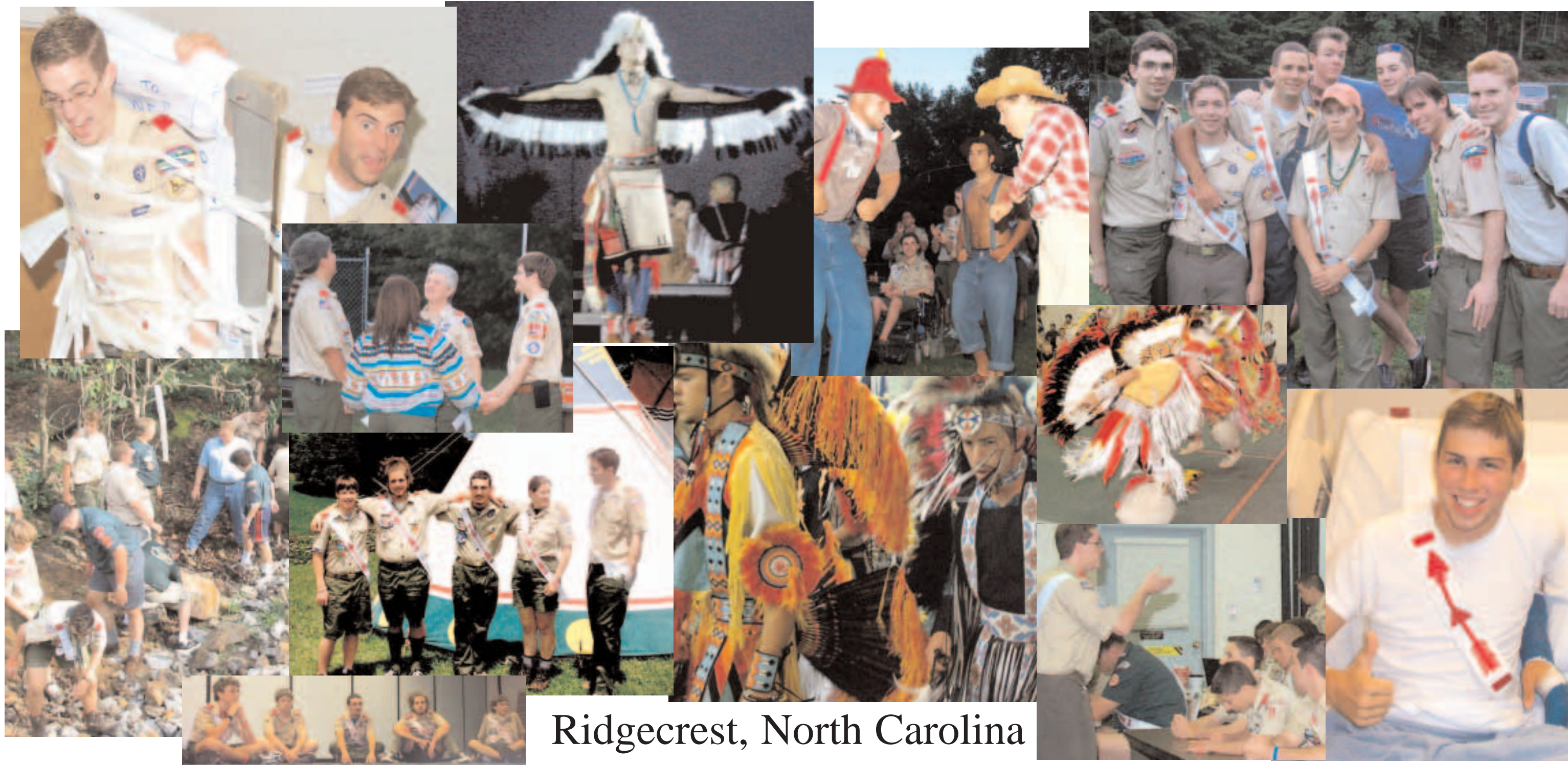
be planned by the 2004 Section Chiefs this December at their annual planning meeting in Dallas, TX.
